
# Winter reflections

# **Vacation Care**

Bookings must be made before 9th of September. No bookings will be taken after this date.

# **Important OSH information**

#### **Curriculum days**

If your child has a curriculum day at school, you must provide us with minimum of 2 days' notice. We withhold the right to refuse care for late bookings, or charge a late fee.

#### Casual days

If you want your child to attend a casual day, you must request this 2 day's prior. We withhold the right to refuse care for late bookings, or charge a late fee. This is to ensure that we have staff on the premises to supervise the children.

## Meal times at OSHC

#### Breakfast

Served from 6:30-8.15am. No breakfast will be served after 8.15am, as we prepare for the bus run.


#### Afternoon tea

# **Ready for School**

This is a list of some skills we will be building on, to prepare children for school.

#### Social skill

Being able to get along with other children, demonstrate basic manners, assert themselves, and being able to play independently as well as with other children.

#### **Emotional maturity**

Being able to manage their emotions, cope with minimal adult contact in large groups, focus on tasks, follow directions and instructions from teachers, cope with the stress of the new school environment, and understand the rules.

#### Language skills

Being able to talk and listen to adults and other children, speak clearly, communicate needs, understand stories, and begin to identify some letters and sounds.

#### **Cognitive Skills**

Basic number sense, basic thinking skills, being able to wait and take turns.

#### Physical health and coordination

Basic health, fine motor skills (such as being able to grip a pencil and turn pages in a book) and physical coordination (being able to run, jump, climb, and play ball).

#### **Independence**

Basic skills to manage their needs without adult supervision, such as going to the toilet, dressing, unwrapping their lunch and managing their belongings.

If you are not sure whether your child is ready to start big school, talk to your child's preschool/ kindergarten teacher or early childhood educator – they will be able to help you with assessing your child's development and readiness for school

# **Enrolments for 2023**

Free Kinder in 2023

Free Three- and Four-Year-Old Kinder will be available across Victoria at participating services in 2023 at our service is one of them. We will be offering 3 days Kinder program for 3 year old Kindergarten both long day care and sessional (standalone) services.

# Free Kinder means more Victorian children can have the best start in life, no matter where they live and we will be offering them:

- For three-year-olds, this means 15 hours per week of a kindergarten program
- For four-year-olds, this means 15 hours per week (600 hours a year)



# Early Start Kindergarten

Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) is a grant funded by the Department of Education and Training (the Department) that provides eligible three-year-old children access to up to 15 hours of free kindergarten per week, including in areas with funded Three-Year-Old Kindergarten.

#### Who is eligible?

The ESK grant is available for children who are:

Three years old by 30 April in the year they are enrolled

#### either:

- from a refugee or asylum seeker background
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- known to Child Protection.
- Enrolled in a kindergarten program delivered by a Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) registered early childhood teacher.
